Message from the Library Director

2021 was a busy year for the Radium Library; we worked hard to provide consistent services, and found creative ways to support our community and encourage community connections. Having established popular grab and go programming the year prior, we were able to provide consistent children's programming throughout the year. We even sent grab and go activities to classrooms at the Edgewater Elementary School and worked with Elementary teachers to provide book club sets through our interlibrary loan system. With the support of the Kootenay Library Federation, we were also able to reach our patrons through various online programs: including adult book clubs, teen book clubs, a teen newspaper, and several webinars.

We also worked towards our goal of fostering strong working relationships with other organizations in the Columbia Valley region to maximize community benefit - it takes a village and we believe the services we provide are essential to not only the Village of Radium, but to our entire service area. We are not just a place for books - we fill the service gaps that are vital to vulnerable populations. Each library is a unique reflection of its community; and Columbia Valley residents are enriched by increased accessibility and the diverse offerings available at neighbouring libraries throughout the Kootenays.

Throughout the year we adjusted our services in accordance with provincial restrictions and were able to return to close to our regular service hours. We were also able to resume our one-on-one tech support program provided in partnership with the Columbia Basin Alliance for Literacy. While the first few months were less stable due to restrictions, once restrictions were lifted, we saw our facility return to a thriving community gathering place.

This year we were also fortunate to have the support of the newly established Friends of the Radium Library group; this hard-working group of volunteers even set up a successful book sale fundraiser in November, and several of our Friends also volunteered to provide outreach to the EES school through a one-on-one Buddy Reads program.

We are grateful to our community for their continued support, and look forward to expanding our services as restrictions allow in the New Year!

More than a place for books... Safe Space, Cooling Centre, Access to Government Resources

This year we updated our website homepage to include accessible links to government resources such as: COVID-19 vaccination information, BC Wildfire Service, 2021 Census information, Anti-Racism, the Homeowner Grant application, and the BC Seniors Guide. Our library also offered free vaccine card printing and lamination services. We also took steps towards honouring our Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action, and have updated our online and in-person resources.

The library also served as a safe space for Newcomers to access government resources, develop community connections, and connect with Settlement services. The library facility also served as an unofficial cooling centre for the community during the heatwave, and staff provided free water bottles to the public.



To ensure children in our community still received consistent access to library programming, we offered frequent grab & go activities and set up outdoor Story Walks. These activities were incredibly popular and allowed us to meet the needs of our community within the context of the pandemic.

In 2021, the Radium Library produced 793 kits to meet community need. An average of 66 kits went out each month!

BC Summer Reading Club (SRC)

For Summer Reading Club 2021, our library offered a combination of online and grab & go activities during the seven week program. We had 45 participants access the grab & go SRC service on a weekly basis. Despite the challenges, the 2021 SRC was a huge success!





The BC Summer Reading Club is sponsored by the British Columbia Library Association, with financial support from Libraries Branch, Ministry of Education, and CUPE BC.

Interlibrary Loan (ILL) - Provincial Resource Sharing System

Resource sharing is a core provincial program that strengthens the British Columbia public library system by increasing the range of materials available to users. Members of any library in BC can request resources from any participating library in BC.

Over 1,280 items went through the ILL system in 2021 - our staff processed an average of 106 outgoing and incoming loans per month.




